If you'd like assistance with the applications or information on other services, our Social Services Program provides information and referrals to Peabody seniors and their families by appointment. Please call 978-531-2254 to schedule an appointment.

Because the waiting lists are so long, it is important to:

- Apply for as many different housing programs as you can.
- See if you fit into any preferences or priorities so that you can improve your chances of getting to the top of the lists more quickly. For more on this, see Who Has Priority. <https://www.masslegalhelp.org/housing/who-has-priority>
- Request a written receipt for all applications you submit. They are your best proof that you have applied for a particular housing program and the date you applied.
- Keep track of your applications and your place on all the waiting lists.
- Notify all the places where you submitted applications of your new address if you move.

Application for Massachusetts Public Housing (CHAMP) website. If you do not want to apply online, you can complete the CHAMP paper application. Both the

online and paper applications are available in English, Chinese, Haitian Creole, Khmer, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Vietnamese.

State-Aided Public Housing is a housing program consisting of apartments that are owned by Local Housing Authorities (LHAs) which are directly rented to qualified and eligible applicants.
